## from the commodore

It's a new year at the Upper Keys Sailing Club, and we have new Flag Officers and Directors who will be working hard to make it a great year. Do you know all the Officers and Directors and their duties?

Your Commodore is Sara Kahler, who was the Rear Commodore for the past two years. The Commodore, according to our bylaws, is like the CEO of the club and is available to the Flag Officers and Directors to help wherever needed. At Board meetings, the Commodore does not vote on motions unless there is a tie, and then the Commodore may vote to break the tie. The Commodore is also responsible for seeing that the lines of communication are open...that all members are informed of what is going on, that members can bring matters to the Board's attention, and that all members can access the club documentation such as the Roster, the Bylaws and the Operations Manual.

The Secretary keeps all the records of the club including minutes of all meetings, and sends out a weekly notice to all members about events of the club. The Secretary is also in charge of publicity for the club, including our newspaper column and our newsletter Signals.

Your Treasurer is Bill Andersen, who has been Treasurer before. The Treasurer handles all funds for the club and pays our bills. The Treasurer processes monthly membership statements and works closely with our Accountants to produce financial reports for the club. The Treasurer also works on the budget for the upcoming fiscal year and provides data to the Audit Committee.

Your Directors this year are Larry Koenig, two-year director and Past Commodore, Pat McLaughlin, Dewey Jackson, Lynda Munshower and Rosa Lamela. These Directors work with the rest of the Board to accomplish the business of the club.

Our club runs on volunteerism, and I urge you to step up and volunteer to be a part of our club's activities. The more that you learn about the club, the more it will mean to you.


